

How do I become a member of Minnehaha United Methodist Church?

In order to become a member of Minnehaha United Methodist Church, you'll take membership vows in front of the congregation on a Sunday morning. You'll promise to attend, give, pray, and serve the church.

A Few More Details

In addition:

- 1. If you've never been baptized, you'll be baptized as part of joining.
- 2. If you were baptized but never confirmed or been a member of any church, you'll reaffirm your baptism as part of joining.
- 3. If you're a member of another Christian denomination, like Baptist, Presbyterian, Episcopal, Catholic, or Lutheran, you'll transfer your membership from that church to Minnehaha United Methodist Church.
- 4. If you're a member of another United Methodist Church, you'll transfer your membership to Minnehaha.

Alternatives to Joining

- You can be an Associate member, where you keep your primary membership in another congregation, but your secondary membership is with Minnehaha.
- You can decide you don't want to take membership vows, but this is still your church. In that case, we'll call you a constituent.

Just a general note – you can participate in almost everything at Minnehaha United Methodist Church without membership requirements. The only things that require membership are voting at all-church meetings and being chair of the church's Board of Trustees.
